# Twin Cube Bands 

UPDATE: SuperDuo beads work wonderfully as a substitute for Twins beads!

MATERIALS: BAND 1<br>(for a 7-inch bracelet, not including clasp)<br>- 3 yards of 6 lb . FireLine<br>- About 200 size 11/0 seed beads<br>- About 64 Color 1 SuperDuo beads<br>- About 16 Color2 SuperDuo beads<br>- About 36 size 3 mm cube beads<br>- clasp

## MATERIALS: BAND 2

(for a 7.25-inch bracelet, not including clasp)

- 8 yards of 6 lb . FireLine
- About 400 size 11/0 seed beads
- About 72 Color1 SuperDuo beads
- About 24 Color2 SuperDuo beads
- About 96 size 4 mm cube beads
- clasp

: SUPERDUO VERSION CHANGES TO BAND 1: STEPS 29 TO 31 ONLY
: Substitute SuperDuo beads for Twin beads and follow the steps for each band as written. A minor
- tweak is needed, however, for Band 2: Because SuperDuo beads are tapered rather than oval like
- Twin beads, the seed beads between the SuperDuo beads along the outer edge of the motif will not $\therefore$ protrude as much as they do when you use Twin beads.
: As such, you can't really grab the seed beads from the adjacent motif as instructed and work these - steps as you would for Twin beads. Instead, when you use SuperDuo beads, Steps 29-31 will be : combined into one step and should read as follows:
: STEP 29-31: String two seed beads, a Color1 SuperDuo bead, a seed bead, a Color1 SuperDuo bead,
- a seed bead, a Color1 SuperDuo bead, two seed beads and a cube bead.
- Go around and up through the cube bead highlighted in RED:

- Subsequently, the individual motifs will abut one another but will not be joined.
